2018 LUTIE A. LYTLE OUTSTANDING SCHOLAR AWARD



Natasha T. Martin
2018 Lutie A. Lytle Outstanding
Scholar Award Honoree

The Lutie A. Lytle Outstanding Scholar Award goes to a consistently participating member of the Lutie Lytle collective who is a trailblazer, who displays exemplary leadership and who is committed to legal education, scholarship and professional development. This year's winner is Natasha T. Martin. She displays all of these qualities and more.

In 2016, Professor Martin was appointed as the inaugural Vice President for Diversity and Inclusion at Seattle University School of Law in Seattle, Washington, where she also served three years as Associate Dean for Research and Faculty Development. She holds a B.S. from Xavier University and a J.D. from Notre Dame. Professor Martin teaches Employment Discrimination, Advanced Topics in Employment Discrimination, and Professional Responsibility. Her scholarly work often addresses interactions among substantive and procedural law and equality norms in the American workplace. She focuses on contemporary workplace realities and the impact of discrimination law on the inclusion of women, people of color and other marginalized workers. She is also an Associate Professor and Research Fellow for the Fred T. Korematsu Center for Law and Equality.

In addition to her teaching and scholarly engagement, Professor Martin actively contributes in many other professional settings. She has served as Chair and Executive Commit-

tee Member of the AALS Executive Committee on Employment Discrimination Law, and was appointed twice to the Washington State Gender and Justice Commission. Professor Martin frequently presents at national conferences, is dedicated to gender and racial equity, and promotes broad notions of inclusivity. Professor Martin was named to Lawyers of Color's 50 Under 50 List of minority law professors, making an impact in legal education in the 2014 Law School Diversity Issue. Before joining the legal academy, Professor Martin spent several years as in-house employment legal counsel and in private law firm practice focusing on employment discrimination litigation. She also served as Federal Judicial Law Clerk in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia.

Professor Martin has been an active Lutie Lytle sister since the earliest stages of the collective. Her commitment to the organization and its values has been made evident by her tireless work to make Lutie Lytle a success. This includes serving on numerous Lutie Lytle planning committees and serving as Lutie Lytle site hostess in 2009. Professor Martin is an exemplary scholar, teacher, mentor, and friend to many. She is indeed a standout participant in Lutie Lytle, and she is the very embodiment of the values of leadership and legacy. We are thrilled to name Natasha Martin as this year's Outstanding Scholar, and we warmly congratulate and commend her.
